What a vibrant, exciting and community-focused week we've had here at Greenfields! Our pupils engaged beautifully with all activities, showing curiosity, kindness and enthusiasm for learning.

World Book Day

On Thursday we celebrated World Book Day, with pupils and staff joining in a joyful day. Our theme this year centred around *101 Dalmatians*, which provided plenty of fun and inspiration. The day reinforced the idea that reading opens doors to imagination, learning and wellbeing — and your children embraced it brilliantly.



SENEDD Visit

Also on Thursday, a group of pupils visited the SENEDD (Welsh Parliament). This supported our ongoing learning about democracy, citizenship and the role of the Welsh Government

This linked closely to UNCRC Article 12 — Every child has the right to express their views and be heard, which we discussed during the visit.



Whole-School Iftar Celebration

On Friday, we came together as a school to learn about Iftar, the meal used by Muslims to break their fast during Ramadan. Pupils explored the values of gratitude, reflection and community, and sampled a variety of foods such as biryani, flatbreads, dates and sweet treats.

This supported our learning around UNCRC Article 14 — Every child has the right to their own beliefs, and helped pupils appreciate and respect the cultural and religious traditions of others.



Wellbeing & Learning Focus

Throughout the week, pupils practised key skills to support learning and emotional development, including:

- Calming and regulation strategies
- Positive self-talk
- Staying focused during learning tasks
- Building confidence in reading and writing

We continue to embed strategies that help pupils feel safe, settled and ready to learn.

Safeguarding & Inclusion Spotlight

This week's safeguarding focus centred on understanding child support and protection. We revisited how children can seek help, who trusted adults are, and how to voice worries safely.
